Monterey Bay Salmon and Trout Project

Save The Earth supports efforts to maintain vital projects such as the Monterey Bay Salmon and Trout Project (MBS&TP).

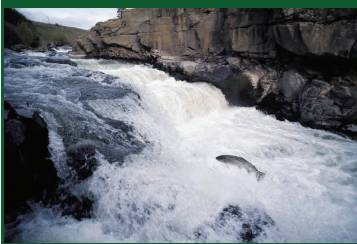
Founded in 1976, MBS&TP is a non-profit organization dedicated to the restoration and enhancement of the native salmon and

steelhead populations of the Greater Monterey Bay area.

The MBS&TP works with the California Department of Fish and Game in eliminating diseases endemic to the salmon habitat and has, to date, released over 1.9 million Coho salmon and steelhead into streams

where they will migrate to the ocean and grow to maturity.

The MBS&TP also supports and funds educational projects in K-12 schools by providing curricula and teacher training on the life cycle and habitat requirements of the local salmon and steelhead populations.
